





Jack I. Hope (1928 -)

After receiving a degree in Aeronautical Engineering, Jack went on to develop advanced aircraft engines, nuclear aircraft engines and advanced military engines. A few of the highlights in his life include being selected by the Secretary of the Army to serve as a member of the Army Scientific Advisory Panel. In 1971, Jack became a full time consultant to the White House office of Science and Technology during the Nixon administration. He was part of an international venture to develop and produce a new commercial aircraft engine, the CFM56, one of most successful commercial aircraft engines in history. This engine is still in production at this writing. After retirement, Jack became involved in local community revitalization, genealogy and historical preservation. Jack has served as a board member and president of the board of HCHS.
